Song Lyrics


- 1. Students look up and write down the chorus of their favorite song.
- 2. Using their thesaurus, students look up words they can replace without changing the meaning of the song.
- 3. Do the words keep the same meaning and retain the musicality of the song? Can students find words that do?

Word Brainstorm

- 1. The teacher picks three words (for example: complicate, abundant, and strong).
- 2. The teacher sets a timer for sixty seconds and asks students to write down as many synonyms and antonyms for those words as they can.
- 3. Students use a thesaurus to check their words and write down other synonym and antonym choices.

Story Shuffle

- 1. Students write a short, simple story of about five sentences. The story could be about a person going to their favorite place on the weekend. Where are they going? What do they do or see?
- 2. Students exchange stories with each other.
- 3. Students rewrite the other person's story using words from their thesaurus.



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
