# Make a One Fish Two Fish Bulletin Board



#### **Supplies:**

- Smart-Fab 48" x 24 ft. Thick and Opaque Background Roll in color of your choice (blue for water)
- Smart-Fab border in desired color (we chose blue)
- Smart-Fab 9" x 12" variety pack (mostly red and blue)
- Stapler

- Scissors
- Plastic sewing needles
- Yarn in desired colors
- Markers
- Batting
- String for fishing line
- Optional: dowel rods or sticks for fishing poles

### Steps to Make a One Fish Two Fish Board

- Cover bulletin board with dark blue, or light blue (we created a wave pattern).
- Add quote/ letters.
- Read class One Fish, Two Fish by Dr. Seuss and hold a class discussion.





### Steps to Make a One Fish Two Fish Board



Demonstrate for students how to draw a fish shape on desired color. Making sure to make the fish shape large and use as much of the 9x12 Smart-Fab as possible. Be careful not to make the part where the tail and body meet too skinny.



- **5** Put two Smart-Fab sheets together and cut out shape.
  - Use marker to add scales, eyes, a mouth.
  - Flip over and repeat.



- 8 Thread plastic needle with a long piece of yarn.
- Puncture Smart-Fab at the mouth of the fish with needle. Use the end of yarn to tie a knot around the edge of Smart-Fab shape and tuck excess inside the pillow.
- Begin sewing around the edge of the fish, leaving only ¼ to ½ inch border and only ¼ inch between stitches.
- 11 Continue sewing until there is only a 2-3 inch gap and stuff batting/ filling into pillow to desired. Make sure you push filling into the corners and bumps.



12 Finish sewing up pillow until you reach the mouth. Double tie the end of the string around the edge and the excess becomes the fishing line.

#### **OPTIONAL**

Add dowel rods/sticks for fishing poles.
