Dictionary Fun for the Classroom

Teacher-led activities using a dictionary

Word Prompts

Merriam-*N*ebster

1. The teacher explains to the students that adjectives are words that describe things, and asks the students what adjectives they would use to describe a bald eagle.



- 2. The students look up the adjectives in a dictionary.
- 3. The teacher asks the students what other things could be described using those adjectives.
- 4. The students write sentences using some of the adjectives they looked up.

The Dictionary Game

- The teacher chooses a word that would be hard 1. for students to define. For example, pandemonium.
- 2. The teacher says the word and spells it for the students.
- 3. Each student (or group of students) writes a made-up definition.
- 4. The teacher writes the real definition.
- 5. The teacher reads all the definitions aloud.
- 6. Students vote for the correct definition.
- 7. Students get points if: (a) someone votes for their definition, or (b) they vote for the correct definition.
- 8. The student with the most points wins!

Story Time

- 1. Working in pairs or groups of three or four, students choose example sentences from the dictionary and use the sentences to make up a story or dialogue.
- 2. Students read their stories aloud or act out their dialogues for the class.

Alphabet Scramble

- 1. The teacher presents a list of words that are out of alphabetical order.
- 2. The students copy the words in the list, placing them in alphabetical order, and use their dictionaries to check their answers.

Silly Sentences

- 1. Students open the dictionary to a random page and make a sentence including three words that they find.
- 2. Each student shares their sentence with the class or another student.
- 3. Students vote for the silliest sentence.


Acrostic Name Poem

- Students write their names vertically with each 1 letter on its own line.
- 2. Students think of adjectives that describe themselves and that start with the letters in their names.
- 3. Students write the adjectives next to the letters in their names to form poems all about them!
